What is Research4Life?

Research4Life is a publicprivate partnership of the FAO, WHO, UNEP, WIPO, ILO, Cornell University, Yale University, the International Association of Scientific, Technical & Medical (STM) Publishers and up to 200 international scientific publishers. Main goal for Research4Life is to reduce the knowledge gap between high-income countries and low and middle-income countries by providing affordable access to high-quality scientific research.

Since 2002, Research4Life has provided researchers from more than 11,000 institutions in more than 125 low- and middle-income countries with free or low-cost online access to up to 205,000 leading journals, books and other resources in health, agriculture, environment, applied sciences and global justice.

Background - R4L and DOAJ collaboration

Research4Life (R4L) is a partnership to provide free or low-cost access to academic resources in developing countries and

Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ) is a comprehensive directory of open-access journals.

- Since 2015, the contents of DOAJ have been added to the R4L journals database
- Being an open-access publisher, the DOAJ material is available to users from all 11,000+ registered institutions
- When publishers request to have titles added to R4L, they are redirected to DOAJ
- The DOAJ acceptance process ensures quality control and electronic access to publications.



R4L and DOAJ collaboration

Last year (2023), **R4L and DOAJ** decided to unite efforts and work together to ensure that high-quality, peer-reviewed journals from underrepresented regions gain the recognition and reach they deserve.

This collaboration represents a significant effort to enhance the visibility and accessibility of local journals, particularly in low and middle-income countries.

This collaboration has succeeded with 4 courses delivered to over 200 participants.

- To bridge the gap between global research and local scholarly output by integrating local journals into the global open-access ecosystem;
- To support the dissemination of locally produced research and strengthen the global academic community by enriching it with diverse perspectives and findings;
- To facilitate the inclusion of local journals in the DOAJ, addressing the challenges faced by researchers in developing regions who often need help gaining visibility on international platforms;



- To ensure that these journals meet the necessary quality standards, which increases their credibility and accessibility to a broader audience and
- To encourage local editors and publishers, including you, to adopt open-access practices, thereby fostering a culture of transparency and knowledge sharing.
